



Minutes of the Extraordinary Meeting of
Haddiscoe Parish Council

Held at Haddiscoe Village Hall on Monday 22nd April 2024 at 7:00pm

1. Councillors Present: Cllr I Fulcher, Cllr R Beevor, Cllr C Chidgey, Cllr C Johnson, Cllr S Kelsey, Cllr B Riley.

In Attendance: L Fulcher (Clerk), 2 parishioners.

2. To consider accepting apologies of absence:
Apologies were received and approved from Cllr Robinson, District Cllr Evans and County Cllr Stone
3. To record declarations of interest and approve any requests for dispensations for disclosable pecuniary interests or other interests:
Cllr Kelsey is a member of Stopit 2

4. Planning Application FUL/2022/0056
The Parish Council had been given more information on the application and unanimously agreed for a working group consisting of Cllr Kelsey and 2 parishioners to draft an additional objection, this would be distributed by the Clerk and if a majority of councillors responded to proceed with the objection via email then the Clerk would submit it via the planning portal.

Additional points to be raised are as follows:

1. Breedons state "Views from church tower over PDA, but not accessible to public. No change in views towards the Church from key directions". This statement is incorrect and misleading. The church tower is accessible and could potentially be used in the future for fundraising activities. The proposed application would restrict the views by at least 1/3rd and the view to St Mathias Church from St Mary's would be blocked.
 2. This bridleway going through the proposed application is the only off road right of way for parishioners to access the local shop in Thorpe next Haddiscoe. Would all parishioners be able to continue using this bridleway if there is a large pit to traverse?
 3. Using the 100m excavation boundary stand-off from the boundary of sensitive residential properties (taken from the developers Air Quality document ES V2 Chapter 10 Air Quality and Dust Haddiscoe Table 10.13.). It results in the excavation stand off zones equating to a reduction in the exploitable area of 33%, and potentially equating to a 50% reduction in tonnage.
5. Norfolk Minerals and Waste Local Plan
The Parish Council has until May 10th to request to speak at the hearing in July and also submit a statement to the programme officer.

The Council also agreed that a request to speak at the July hearing will be made.
 6. Confirm the time and date of the next meeting - The Annual Parish Meeting followed by the Annual Council Meeting on 13th May, 7pm at Haddiscoe Village Hall
